Definitions

Sponsored Program: "A sponsored project is an activity sponsored, or funded, by an external organization, such as a federal, state, or private organization or agency." Characteristics of a sponsored project include a specific scope of work or set of aims, financial accountability (i.e., the funds must be separately budgeted and accounted for), a specific performance period, and deliverables.

Investigator: "the project director or principal Investigator and any other person, regardless of title or position, who is responsible for the design, conduct, or reporting of" both active or proposed externally-funded projects.

Institutional Responsibilities: "[A]n Investigator's professional responsibilities on behalf of the Institution, and as defined by the Institution in its policy on financial conflicts of interest, which may include, for example, activities such as research, research consultation, teaching, professional practice, institutional committee memberships, and service on panels such as Institutional Review Boards or Data and Safety Monitoring Boards."⁴

Significant Financial Interest: A financial interest "of the Investigator (and those of the Investigator's spouse and dependent children) that reasonably appears to be related to the Investigator's institutional responsibilities."⁴

"The term significant financial interest does **not** include the following types of financial interests:

- [S]alary, royalties, or other remuneration paid by the Institution to the Investigator if the Investigator is currently employed or otherwise appointed by the Institution, including intellectual property rights assigned to the Institution and agreements to share in royalties related to such rights;
- any ownership interest in the Institution held by the Investigator, if the Institution is a commercial or forprofit organization; income from investment vehicles, such as mutual funds and retirement accounts, as long as the Investigator does not directly control the investment decisions made in these vehicles;
- income from seminars, lectures, or teaching engagements sponsored by a Federal, state, or local
 government agency, an Institution of higher education as defined at <u>20 U.S.C. 1001(a)</u>, an academic
 teaching hospital, a medical center, or a research institute that is affiliated with an Institution of higher
 education;
- or income from service on advisory committees or review panels for a Federal, state, or local government agency, an Institution of higher education as defined at <u>20 U.S.C. 1001(a)</u>, an academic teaching hospital, a medical center, or a research institute that is affiliated with an Institution of higher education."⁴

<u>Foreign Influence</u>: A foreign entity with the power to direct or influence the management or operation of an individual or organization or lead to unauthorized access to sensitive information.⁵

<u>Foreign Talent Recruitment Program</u>: A "program, position, or activity that includes compensation in the form of cash, in-kind compensation, including research funding, promised future compensation, complimentary foreign travel, things of non de minimis value, honorific titles, career advancement opportunities, or other types of remuneration or consideration directly provided by a foreign country at any level (national, provincial, or local) or their designee, or an entity based in, funded by, or affiliated with a foreign country, whether or not directly sponsored by the foreign country, to an individual, whether directly or indirectly stated in the arrangement, contract, or other documentation at issue."¹
