6. Business Statistics

What are statistics used for and how do they impact us? Amy Doering, Bradley instructor of Quantitative Methods and Investment Analysis, and Director of Project Springboard, will present a general overview of descriptive statistics and a brief introduction to inferential statistics. Rabbi Michael Lerner's book "The Left Hand of God" gives us a unique lens through which to understand contemporary politics and particularly the relationship between politics and religion. The instructor is Michael Brown, minister of Universalist Unitarian Church. (RI/NC)

8. Peoria Reads—Attention to Books That Matter!

We will enrich our discussion of Peoria's 2008 Big Read selection, Fahrenheit 451, with details about Ray Bradbury's career from The Bradbury Chronicles by Chicago writer Sam Weller and with some of Bradbury's shorter works. We will also discuss the 2008 runner-up: A Thousand Splendid Suns by Khaled Hosseini and God of Animals by Arvn Kyle (who has Peoria ties). Gary Loss, Deputy for Programs Management, Rock Island District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, will discuss water transportation on the Illinois River. 12. Life Long Learning thru the WWW

15. Bradley Happenings

Jane Linnenburger and Rick Smith, of Bradley's Smith Career Center, will discuss how much of today's hiring occurs by using the internet. George Brown, Theatre Arts Chair, will present an afternoon rehearsal of the telematic production of Alice in Wonderland being created among the University of Central Florida, the University of Waterloo, and Bradley. 16. Illinois and the Global Economy: **Understanding Our Successes and Failures**

In this course we will be paying particular attention to the Arabic terminology that defines the Muslim community. The course proceeds historically, focusing on pre-Islamic Arabia, the life of Muhammad, the split between Shi'ites and Sunnis, and the points of contact between Islam and the West up to current times. 18. Tropical Insects

Mark DuBois, hobbyist in entomology, will share his experiences collecting insects in various tropical locales. He will examine a number of tropical insects, discuss their natural history, and help us understand a little more about insects and the world around us. (NI/NC)
