WHO |S OLL!?

The Bradley University Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) is a group of over 700 learners, age 50 and over, who learn together through three distinct programs.

Three times each year, we meet at Bradley and enjoy presentations by volunteers who teach four 1-hour sessions on a subject of their choice. OLLI Classes cover all topics and disciplines and regularly include a few hands-on computer classes.

We also take Learning Trips, held throughout the year and throughout the region. With a focus on learning, we enjoy behind-the-scenes explanations, step-on guides, and docent-led tours that enrich each of our excursions. Transportation is provided, and lunch is generally included on these half day and full day trips.

Study Groups are another feature of OLLI. These member-facilitated groups convene around a topic of mutual interest and include discussions and presentations by the group's members. Study groups generally meet two hours for five or six weeks and convene throughout the year.

In essence, OLLI is our opportunity, at 50 and over, to learn again. It's an organization that enables us to revisit old interests and develop new ones; to rekindle old friendships and make new ones-with people like ourselves. It's our time to learn!

You should be able to: enter/exit van with minimal assistance, climb some stairs, stand for up to an hour, and walk a few blocks indoors or out.

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You should be able do all activities from Level 1, and: climb a few flights of stairs and walk on uneven surfaces over the course of a day.

These learning trips are in-depth visits to local businesses and attractions. The price of each trip varies, but includes all activities, meals, tips, and van transportation. Detailed handouts and timelines are provided with your registration confirmation. Seats are usually limited to 20.

Fired Up Studio (i)
Tuesday, June 30, 2009, 3:00 – 6:00 p.m.

Art helps everyone learn, and the owners of Fired Up, a paint-your-own pottery and art studio, will show us how they have turned their passion for learning into a successful business. After the tour, OLLI members (and their younger guests) will have two hours of studio time to paint – and keep – their own pottery mugs. Once our mugs are complete we'll walk to Emack & Bolio's for a delicious ice cream treat. \$25 – includes tour, studio time, mug to paint, ice cream, and transportation. Please register by June 16.

Summer Picnic and Concert at Springdale Friday, July 10, 2009, 4:00 – 8:00 p.m.

It's an annual tradition – the OLLI summer picnic. This year, we'll start with an early evening tour of historic Springdale Cemetery, the resting place of many Peoria legends, including Bradley University founder Lydia Moss Bradley. After the tour, we'll gather for a gourmet picnic dinner, play croquet and other lawn games, then end the evening with a first-of-its-kind concert by the Peoria Municipal Band. \$29 – includes tour, picnic dinner, activities, and concert (no transportation; meet at Springdale). Please register by June 30.

Peoria Journal Star: Behind the Scenes Thursday, July 16, 2009, 11:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

After lunch at Avanti's, OLLI member, Bernie Drake, will take us on a behind-the-scenes look at Peoria's only daily newspaper, the *Journal Star*. We'll learn how each of the newspaper's departments contribute to the process of publishing the paper 365 days a year. We'll also have an exclusive opportunity to meet with a reporter to ask about the newspaper's stories and editorials. \$22 – includes lunch, tour, and round-trip van transportation. Kickapoo Creek Winery Mednesday, August 19, 2009, 11:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

Our setting will be the beautiful lakes, bridges, and vineyards of the Kickapoo Creek Winery in Edwards. After a delicious buffet lunch in the tasting room, we'll spend part of the day taking a leisurely stroll along the walking trails, learning more about the winery's beautiful hostas, viburnum, and other plant varieties. We'll then hop aboard the Grape Train, which will transport us back to the tasting room for a tasting of the local wines, cheeses, jellies, and other fine products. \$29 – includes tour, docent fees, buffet lunch, wine tasting, and round-trip van transportation. Peoria Photography Experience Friday, August 21, 11:30 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. and Friday, August 28, 2009, 9:00 – 11:00 a.m.

Photography experts Ray Keithley and Barb Hoffman (who specializes in urban landscapes) will lead this unique excursion into downtown Peoria to document the many changes occurring throughout the River City. On August 21, we'll eat lunch at Kelleher's, then learn how to best photograph the buildings near the riverfront, the future museum block, and the Pere Marquette Hotel. One week later, we'll meet at the Michel Student Center to exchange photos and present a display of past, present, and future comparisons of Peoria. No photography experience needed – just bring a camera! \$29 – includes lunch, guided photo session, presentation materials, and round-trip van transportation.

REGIONAL TRIPS

These learning trips are day-long opportunities to enjoy a variety of activities throughout Illinois and nearby states. The price of each trip varies, but includes fees, lunch, tips, snacks, and round-trip transportation via Peoria Charter Coach. Detailed handouts are provided with your registration confirmation. Seats are usually limited to 50.

Spirit of Peoria Cruise with Michael Wiant Saturday, June 27, 2009

Join us as we spend a beautiful summer afternoon cruising along the picturesque Illinois River on the state's only authentic paddle-wheeler, the Spirit of Peoria. During the two-hour excursion, which includes a full buffet lunch, Michael Wiant, Dickson Mounds Museum Director, will give an exclusive presentation on the Illinois River. His fascinating stories will help illustrate the character of the Illinois River and trace its interaction with the people who have lived along it. \$35 – includes ticket, buffet lunch, cruise, and talk by Michael Wiant (no transportation; meet at the Peoria riverfront). Please register by June 16.

Downtown Chicago Bike-n-Hike Market Wednesday, July 8, 2009

In this first-of-its-kind trip, we will travel to Chicago to learn about the city ... on bike and on foot! The day will start with a leisurely biking tour of lakefront neighborhoods. Our tour guides will make many stops along the way for photos, water breaks, and interesting stories about these Windy City landmarks. After lunch at Lizzie McNeill's (where we'll enjoy outdoor seating), we'll head to Michigan Avenue for a private, early evening walking tour of Chicago's historic skyscrapers. Docents from the Chicago Architecture Foundation will take us in and around several world famous early skyscrapers. \$129 – includes round-trip charter bus transportation, bike and helmet rental, docent fees, lunch, and snacks. Please register by June 17.

Segway & Exchange with Northwestern University Wednesday, July 29, 2009

One of the most popular learning trips is back – with a twist. We've reserved dozens of Segways for a two-hour gliding tour along the Chicago Lakefront Bike Path. The tour docents will share fascinating stories about the Windy City while we make several photo stops along the Skyline. Here's the twist: over our lunch break on Michigan Avenue, we'll be joined by OLLI members from Northwestern University for a unique opportunity to share ideas, suggestions, and brainstorm with our lifelong learning friends! \$159 – includes round-trip charter bus transportation, Segway and helmet rental, training session, docent fees, lunch, and snacks. Please register by July 7.

Monsanto Seeds & Missouri Botanical Garden Market Wednesday, August 5, 2009

Spend a day in St. Louis when we visit Monsanto's Chesterfield Village Research Center and the Missouri Botanical Garden. Chesterfield Village, one of the world's largest facilities devoted to plant biotechnology, includes 250 laboratories, 100 plant growth chambers, and two acres of greenhouse space. After lunch at Zia's on The Hill, we'll travel to the Missouri Botanical Garden. There, we'll enjoy a private guided tram tour of the nation's oldest botanical garden, including a 14-acre Japanese strolling garden and one of the worlds' largest collections of rare orchids. \$99 – includes round-trip charter bus transportation, tours, docent fees, lunch, and snacks. Please register by July 27.

Harry Potter Exhibition Saturday, August 15, 2009

Are the words Gryffendor, Dumbledore, Hogwarts, and Quidditch part of your vocabulary? If so, join us as we immerse ourselves in the world of wizardry at the Museum of Science and Industry's Harry Potter: The Exhibition. OLLI members (and their younger companions) will get a look inside the famous wizard's magical world via elaborate displays of artifacts and props. \$99 (ages 12+) and \$94 (ages 8-11) – includes round-trip charter bus transportation, museum admission, exhibit admission, lunch, and snacks. This newest OLLI program is already a hit! We know that you enjoy the challenge of in-depth learning.

Unlike our Classes, which meet for four 1-hour sessions, Study Groups meet longer (generally six 2-hour sessions), drill deeper into the topic, and invite your participation. In fact, a key premise of a successful study group is that YOU contribute to the learning.

That doesn't mean you'll be graded or tested, but it does mean you will work. You will be asked to discuss, or present, or read, or react, or write and, best of all, you will enjoy the conversations you will share with your like-minded peers.

Join in a lively discussion of one of the most influential clans in American social and political history. We'll explore both the Hudson Bay and Oyster Bay Roosevelts and their impact on American society and culture.


I acknowledge that my participation involves some personal risk. For each trip, I will wear closed-toed shoes and agree to use any other safety equipment required of the host site.
