LEARNING TRIPS

Participation in Learning Trips is worry-free. All travel arrangements are made by staff in Continuing Education, parking is reserved during the trips, and most fees are included. To make your trip even more enjoyable, please note:

All Learning Trip times in this brochure are approximate and subject to change. Please refer to your confirmation handout (mailed upon registration) for specific departure, tour, and arrival times.

Many of our Learning Trips require walking and standing in various terrains and environments. To ensure your safety and to respect our hosts' regulations, everyone is required to wear closed-toed shoes on our trips.

Each Learning Trip and Special Event includes an activity level number. Before you register, make sure the activity level matches your abilities. This will ensure an enjoyable trip for you and those who travel with you.

- (1) Enter/exit vehicle with minimal assistance, climb some stairs, stand for up to an hour, and walk a few blocks indoors or out.
- (2) Level 1, plus: climb some flights of stairs and walk on uneven surfaces.
- (3) Levels 1 & 2, plus: healthy, mobile, and able to participate in 3-5 hours of daily physical activity.
- (4) Levels 1 3, plus: able to participate in 6 hours of daily moderate activity.

LOCAL TRIPS

Get to know your community on these half-day excursions to local sites. The price includes meal, van transportation, entrance fees, and tour guides. Detailed itineraries are mailed upon registration. Register early – these trips are usually limited to 20 and fill quickly.

Peoria Riverfront Museum Hardhat Tour (2) Tuesday, May 29, 11:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. OR Tuesday, June 5, 11:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m. OR Tuesday, June 19, 11:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

Jim Richerson, Lakeview and Peoria Riverfront Museum President and CEO, will guide our exclusive hardhat tour of the downtown facility, which is scheduled for completion later this fall. Following the hour-long tour of the construction site, we will travel to Lakeview Museum for lunch and Q and As. \$22 – includes lunch, tour, presentation, and van transportation.

An Evening with the Heartland Festival Orchestra (1) Saturday, June 2, 5:45 – 9:30 p.m.

The Heartland Festival Orchestra will take another look at the genius who was Mozart with the works of the man, his father, and sometime rival. Our evening at Five Points in Washington will begin with a buffet dinner, followed by a presentation by Conductor David Commanday, then the performance featuring violin soloist Stefan Milenkovich.

\$59 – includes catered dinner, pre-show lecture, and tickets to performance. Transportation not provided – meet us there!

St. Mary's Cemetery Hike (3) Wednesday, June 6, 8:45 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

David Pittman, environmental activist and frequent OLLI hike instructor, will lead our group to St. Mary's Cemetery in West Peoria as we explore the history of the 131-year-old burial ground. During the hike, David will discuss several aspects of the cemetery, which was once known as nature's cathedral and proclaimed as one of the most impressive views in America. \$22 – includes lunch, tour, and van transportation.

Gilles Family Farm (2) Wednesday, July 11, 8:15 a.m. – 2:30 p.m.

OLLI has reserved a limited number of seats on this tour of a family-owned farm in Princeville, presented by the Peoria County Soil and Water Conservation District and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. During a presentation and hayrack ride tour of the 700-acre farm, we'll learn about the farm's native prairies and view the plantings, grasses, and blooming flowers. After the tour, we'll enjoy lunch in nearby Kickapoo. \$22 – includes lunch, tour, and van transportation.

Springdale Tour and Concert (I) Friday, July 13, 4:45 – 9:00 p.m.

Back in 2009, we enjoyed a delightful tour, picnic, and concert at Springdale Cemetery. Join us again as we spend a beautiful midsummer evening at historic Springdale, the resting place of many Peoria legends, including Bradley University founder Lydia Moss Bradley. We'll take a private tour of the grounds (on a bus), gather for a gourmet picnic dinner, then enjoy a twilight performance by the Peoria Municipal Band.

\$29 – includes tour, picnic dinner, and performance. No transportation – meet us there!

Moss-Bradley Neighborhood Garden Walk (2) Wednesday, August 8, 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m.

Florist Dan Callahan, a longtime resident of the Moss-Bradley area, will lead our walking tour of gardens in his neighborhood. Dan, who has a background in architectural studies and a lifelong interest in gardening, will give our group commentary on buildings and gardens along the two-mile loop. We'll get a peek into some private gardens and learn more about the Western Avenue Greenway Park, too.

\$22 – includes tour and lunch. No transportation – meet us there!

Pat Sullivan's Downtown (1) Thursday, August 16, 11:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m.

Pat Sullivan, Peoria native, entrepreneur, and co-developer of the city's warehouse district, will be our host as we tour some of the downtown buildings that have been revitalized in recent years. Participants will get a private, behind-the-scenes look at the Le Vieux Carre building on Water Street and the headquarters for Water Street Solutions, located next door in the former downtown post office facility.

\$22 – includes lunch, tour, and van transportation.

Birding Hike at Forest Park Nature Center (2) Tuesday, August 21, 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

Dean Johnston, a naturalist at Forest Park Nature Center, will lead our group as we explore the basics of birding for beginners. During a two-hour walk through the forests and prairies, we'll learn some basic bird biology, identification, and how to use the tools of the trade (binoculars and field guides). Participants are encouraged to bring their own binoculars and guides, as a limited number will be available to use on site.

\$25 – includes lunch, tour, and van transportation.

REGIONAL TRIPS

Spend time with OLLI enjoying travel throughout Illinois and nearby states. The price of each trip varies, but includes meal, charter coach transportation (unless otherwise indicated), entrance fees, gratuities, snacks, and tour guides. Detailed itineraries are mailed upon registration. Register early – these trips are usually limited to 40 and fill quickly.

Chicago: City in a Garden (2) Thursday, June 7, 6:30 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

Spend a summer day learning about Chicago's vision of maintaining green space in the city when we tour the Alfred Caldwell Lily Pool, the Nature Boardwalk at Lincoln Park Zoo, Millennium Park's Lurie Gardens, and the Garfield Park Conservatory. Pam Risher, one of OLLI's favorite step-on guides, will accompany our group to enhance our learning. Between tours, we'll eat at Carmine's on Rush. \$109 – includes tours, lunch, gratuities, snacks, bottled water,

Othello: Illinois Shakespeare Festival, Normal (1) Tuesday, June 26, 4:30 – 11:30 p.m..

The Illinois Shakespeare Festival is a cherished OLLI tradition. This year, we have tickets for *Othello*, a story of jealousy, deception, and intrigue. Dr. Susan Hillabold, frequent OLLI instructor, will accompany our group to provide insight throughout the trip. The evening will include a picnic dinner with wine and backstage tour.

\$89 – includes tour, dinner, wine, center section platinum seats, gratuities, snacks, and charter coach transportation.

Chicago via Segway (2) Thursday, June 28, 6:30 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.

We've reserved several dozen Segways for a two-hour gliding tour along the Chicago Lakefront Bike Path. Tour docents will share fascinating stories about the Windy City while we make several photo stops along the Skyline. Half the group will ride the Segways in the morning, and the other half will have free time to explore downtown Chicago. We'll meet for lunch as a group, then switch the tour/explore schedule in the afternoon. \$159 – includes guided Segway tour, all rental and equipment fees, lunch, gratuities, snacks, bottled water, and charter coach transportation.

Arthur's Amish Countryside (1) Thursday, July 19, 7:30 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

Immerse yourself in the Amish culture when we spend a day in Arthur, Illinois. Our visit will begin with a tour of the Illinois Amish Interpretive Center Museum, followed by a step-on guided tour of the countryside to see significant homes, schools, farms, and businesses. For lunch, we'll visit an Amish home for a homemade, family-style meal.

\$89 – includes guided tours, lunch, gratuities, snacks, bottled water, and charter coach transportation.

Cabaret: Festival 56 (1)

Thursday, August 2, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Our day in Princeton will begin with a light continental breakfast at the Princeton Theatre, where Dexter Brigham, a BU alum and Executive Director of the theatre, will provide a backstage look at the venue, followed by a step-on tour around town. After a buffet lunch, we'll watch a matinee performance of *Cabaret*, by Festival 56, Illinois' largest summer theatre festival. \$85 – includes tour, lunch, performance, gratuities, snacks, bottled water, and charter coach transportation.

MULTIDAY TRIPS

Wine and Wilder (1) Monday, July 9 – Wednesday, July 11

Join us for this three-day exploration of the wine region of Missouri, including historic downtown Fulton (featuring the Winston Churchill Memorial and Library at Westminster College) and the picturesque German community of Hermann, offering spectacular views, more than 150 historic buildings, world class wineries, museums, and galleries. Our days will be filled with scenic drives and tours, tastings, and meals, plus a special tour of the Laura Ingalls Wilder Museum and Rocky Ridge Farm, where Laura wrote the Little House books. \$450 per person for double occupancy; \$570 per person for single occupancy – includes lodging, all admission fees, charter coach transportation, gratuities, wine tasting and tour fees, and all meals except dinner on the return to Peoria.

Join us as we learn about the plants, cultures, and processes involved in making wine, beer, and spirits – with cocktails!

U.S. Grant and a River of Lies (1) Presented by Dr. Michael B. Ballard Wednesday, June 27, Refreshments 6:30 – 7:00 p.m.

Presentation 7:00 – 8:00 p.m. Bradley Hall, First Floor Lecture Room

Dr. Michael B. Ballard, Coordinator, Congressional and Political Research Center and University Archivist, Mississippi State University, will be on campus to explain how many historians have accepted a story about General Ulysses S. Grant's alleged drinking during the siege of Vicksburg without bothering to investigate it. Join us as Dr. Ballard will explain why it's "a good story, but none of it is true."

STUDY GROUPS

Maybe you want to drill down or dig into a subject of special interest to you. That's the focus of OLLI Study Groups where we investigate a topic in depth. These discussion-based classes often include the opportunity for us to make presentations, lead a discussion, or do some reading or work outside the class. In this arrangement, each of us is both a learner and a teacher.

While Bradley University is often our base of operation, we also have several community partners who are opening their doors to OLLI Study Groups. Lutheran Hillside Village, Methodist North, Peoria NEXT Innovation Center, Proctor Endowment Home, and Riverview Senior Living are great venues for this friendly give-and-take OLLI program.

British Women Novelists Tuesdays, June 5 - June 26 2:30 - 4:00 p.m. Riverview Senior Living

We will read two novels, with a focus on the Bildungsroman (the novel of education) by two British women novelists. The 19th century novel will be *Jane Eyre* (1847) by Charlotte Bronte. From the 20th century we'll look at *Oranges Are Not the Only Fruit* (1985) by Jeannette Winterson. Two weeks will be spent on each book. The first week will focus on the novel itself, discussing themes and cultural connections while the second will introduce a film adaptation of that novel. Participants should read both novels prior to the start of the group.

The Forgotten 500

Back by popular demand, this Study Group is about Gregory Freeman's book *The Forgotten 500*, the previously untold story of over 500 American airmen who risked their lives to rescue American pilots who were shot down over Yugoslavia as they were bombing Italy during World War II. We will have the opportunity to meet Mr. Bob Wilson, who was one of these men (and an OLLI member). Participants should read about one-quarter of the book prior to each session.

Why does it often feel good to do something bad? In a world where we are encouraged to indulge, splurge, live a little – even visit "Sin City" – has the ancient religious concept of sin lost its way over the moral imagination? Your fee includes *The Seven Deadly Sins Sampler*, a \$20 book of stories published by the Great Books Foundation. Janet Lange will lead us as we peer into the hidden recesses of sinful thought and behavior. Each week, participants will read a chapter from the book pertaining to a specific sin and be prepared to interpret and evaluate the text through shared inquiry and discussion.

Join Jon C. Neidy for this investigative Study Group in which we will review articles promoting the benefits of and identifying concerns about social media. Facebook, Twitter, Google+, and LinkedIn are the four common providers we will use as the foundation for our discussions. At the conclusion, we will determine for ourselves, and as an investigative team, whether or not social media is a blessing or a curse. Midwest Prairie Plants

Do you want a prairie in your yard? Can this be done in the city? In the county? We will discuss the pros and cons of prairie plantings and what effect they have on the ecosystem. We will also review some prairie plant varieties and discuss techniques of establishing a prairie planting. Participants will be asked to choose a prairie plant to research and present. \$44 – facilitated by Jerry Whitledge, an ornamental horticulturist and Master Gardener who has been establishing prairie plantings for fifteen years.

The World of Charles Dickens Thursdays, August 2 – August 23 Methodist North on Allen Road 1:00 – 3:00 p.m.

In celebration of his 200th birthday, we will look at Charles Dickens – philanthropist, social critic, long-distance walker, traveler, and great party-giver. He was also an amateur criminologist, actor, and hypnotist. Most importantly, he is among the very best writers of the Western world. Marge Semmens will discuss *Little Nell* and *The Old Curiosity Shop*, Peggy Carter will talk about *The Mystery of Edwin Drood*, Jean Gronewold will consider some of Dickens' favorite paintings and Pre-Raphaelite artists, and Jacqueline Kapanjie will help participants learn about 19th century London and Dickens' friends and family. Participants are expected to read both books prior to the start of the group.

Learn about Hemingway and Hadley, Scott and Zelda, Archibald MacLeish, Josephine Baker, Ezra Pound, and many others as we return to Paris in the 1920s and 30s for a discussion of the expatriate community who Gertrude Stein called "The Lost Generation." Through reading Hemingway's *A Moveable Feast* and viewing film clips, we'll consider the expats' personalities, their relationships, and their work. Participants will be expected to read *A Moveable Feast*. Each participant will be encouraged to make a brief presentation about an expatriate or related topic.
